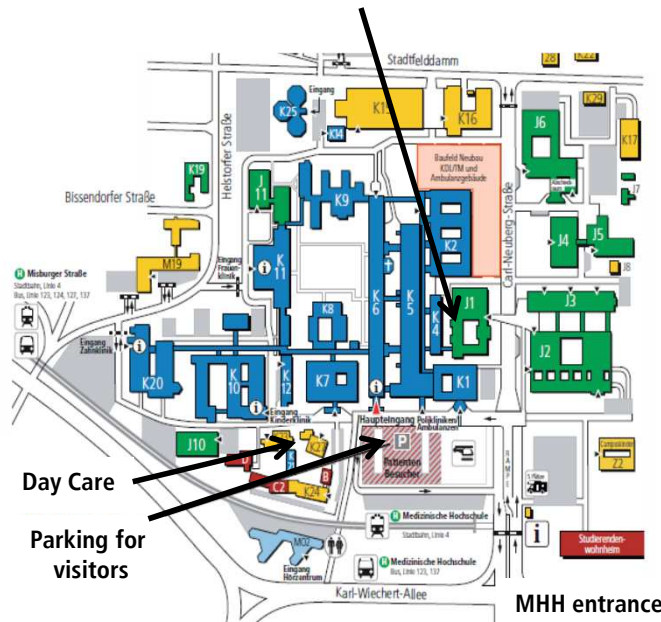

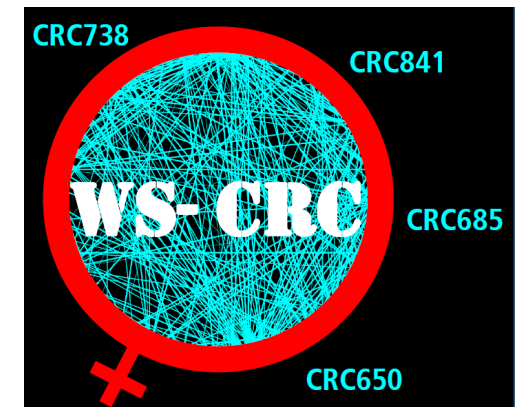

# Program

The Collaborative Research Center 738 (CRC738) funded by the German Research Council (DFG) researches the optimization of conventional and innovative transplants. Women scientists in the CRC738 (WS-CRC738) is a group of principal investigators, post-docs and students taking advantage of the additional gender equality funds allowed by the DFG as an opportunity to prepare them better for their career advancement.

Through monthly meetings held since February 2012, the WS-CRC738 presents scientific results, network and share experiences related to their careers and life-work balance. Our WS-CRC initiative is also enriched by professional workshops organized regularly covering aspects of academic tenure (with the German Academic Union - "Deutscher Hochschulverband"), project management and soft-skills development.

This current WS-CRC workshop will include three CRC female principal investigators from other institutions working in related biomedical topics as ours: Cecile Gouttefangeas (University of Tübingen), Birgit Sawitzki (Charité Berlin) and Linda Diehl (UKE Hamburg). They will share with us their science and their motivations for further development of leading women in science in a "Speed-Networking".

For further information and a round table, we invited the participation of representatives from the Ministry of Science and Culture of the State of Lower Saxony (Dr. Barbara Hartung) and from the MHH Gender office (Dr. Bärbel Miemietz).

Ultimately, our purpose with this workshop is to extend our initial concept of WS-CRC networking, such that the scientific and contact exchanges among WS in CRCs will further advance to the national level.

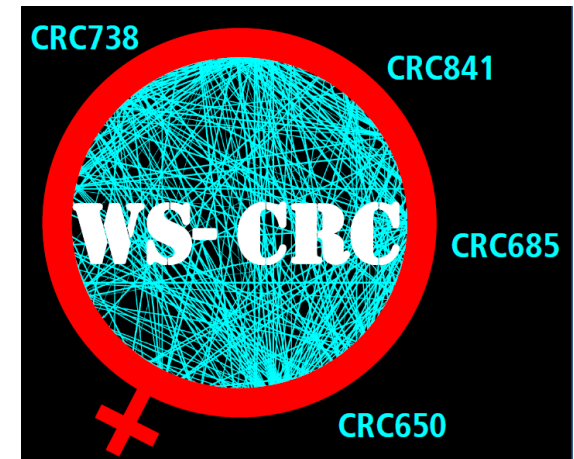
